



# 2018-2019 Program Overview

Dear Educators,

Thank you for participating in the Six Flags® Read to Succeed Six Hour Reading Club!

## IMPORTANT PROGRAM GUIDELINES:

- Only Traditional schools and Homeschools with students enrolled in grades K through 6 are eligible to participate. Please review the Eligibility document to confirm that your school is eligible.
- Student Reading Logs and program materials are available in your online account in the TEACHER TOOLBOX tab. Only use the materials from the TEACHER TOOLBOX. **DO NOT use materials found anywhere else as they could have incorrect information and content.**
- Students must complete 6 hours (360 minutes) of recreational reading to earn one FREE Six Flags ticket.
- Students can read books, eBooks, magazines, newspapers or comic books (digital or hardcopy). Reading for homework or a class assignment does NOT count.
- The Student Reading Log and Parent Letter will have a fill-in-the-blank area for you to write the deadline date you want the students to return the Reading Log to you. We suggest having the students return the Reading Log to you in early February. You will need to remind your students and parents to return the Reading Logs back to you on time, to give you enough time to enter all student information in your online account before the program deadline, **March 1, 2019**, as late entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- **Teachers must have at least 8 students that complete the required 6 hours of reading to earn a FREE Teacher Ticket by entering their student information in their online account by the deadline.** Student information must be entered in the "Your Students" tab and must include the total HOURS read. Total hours for each student must be at least 6 to qualify.
- Each Traditional school will need one registered Coordinator. The Coordinator will earn a teacher ticket for facilitating the program as long as they have at least 1 teacher with 8 students that completed the required reading. The teacher must appear in the coordinator's online account under the "My Teachers" tab. Only Traditional schools can have a coordinator.
- The Coordinator can be a teacher or school employee, such as the librarian, media specialist or even a parent volunteer. Coordinators are not responsible for registering each teacher. However, the Coordinator can register the teachers, if that is how you choose to run the program at your school. Teachers must have their students added into their accounts by the deadline. The Coordinator does not need to enter every student. However, the coordinator can enter the students for the teachers, if that is how you choose to run the program at your school. The students that have met the 6 hour goal **MUST** be entered under the correct teacher's account for the teachers to earn their ticket.
- Educators (both at Traditional schools and Homeschools) who teach grades K through 6<sup>th</sup> can register. Each homeschool can only have one registered teacher.
- The Homeschool program is NOT open to co-ops or homeschool groups. Each individual homeschool family must register on their own.

- There are two parts to the program, the handwritten part and the online part. Both need to be completed to earn tickets.
  1. The Student Reading Logs are handwritten by the students/parents as they log their minutes from reading. Students need to turn the logs into their teacher. Teachers/coordinators will NOT have to mail the handwritten Student Reading Logs to Six Flags. However, we do ask that teachers save the completed handwritten Student Reading Logs in a safe place for future reference. Six Flags conducts periodic reviews of Student Reading Logs, therefore please keep the Student Reading Logs in your files in the event you are selected to submit the Student Reading Logs for review.
  2. Educators will need to register online if they did not participate last year. Those who registered last year, can log into their account and confirm their information is correct or make any necessary edits. Once you are registered, you will have an online account. You will need to enter your students' names and total hours they have read in your online account. If your school coordinator enters the students' names and hours in their online account, you WILL NOT get the credit for having your students complete the program, and you WILL NOT earn a FREE Teacher Ticket. YOU need to enter your own students in YOUR online account to earn a FREE Teacher Ticket.
- Begin the program as soon as registration opens in the fall to give your students plenty of time to read the required 6 hours.
- Give yourself enough time to complete the online submission well before the deadline of March 1, 2019.

## ABOUT THE TICKETS

- The Student and Teacher Tickets are valid for admission on **select dates only** during the 2019 season. The valid dates will be included on the tickets.
- The tickets are only valid at **one** participating Six Flags Theme Park that the coordinator will select for the entire school.
- Tickets are valid for students in grades K-6 only, and are not valid for anyone over the age of 13. No exceptions.
- Each ticket is valid for **one** free admission only.
- Tickets cannot be used for school groups, group outings or field trips.
- If you try to use the Read to Succeed tickets for any school group, group outing or field trip, the tickets will not be accepted.
- **Tickets are not for resale and are nontransferable. Selling tickets will disqualify you and your entire school.**
- Once tickets are issued, they cannot be replaced if lost, stolen or damaged.
- The tickets will be distributed electronically, through **email and your online account** in early May.
- A Season Pass upgrade offer will be available during the ticket valid dates. The upgrade offer information will be printed on the ticket.
