

Rules and Restrictions for Public Assembly, Expressive Activity and Protests

The entrance ways, driving and walking paths, parking lots, entrance and admission areas, restaurants, animal viewing areas, and the amusement and animal park as a whole, are all on private property. These areas are not open to the public for purposes of congregation, assembly, and/or protest, and are not public or quasi-public forums. As such, no protests or similar expressive activities, whether orally or in writing (signs, handbills, leaflets, papers, etc.) are allowed on that private property. Any protests or similar expressive activity, if conducted, must be done from the sidewalks, in front of Six Flags Discovery Kingdom, as designated on the attached map.

Any failure to comply with these rules may result in a trespass and/or interference with business, both of which are prohibited by the California Penal Code, and punishable by law.

To the extent that any person enters Six Flags Discovery Kingdom via a single-day ticket, membership season pass, Easy-Pay season pass, Thrill Pass, or regular season pass, such person must refrain from questioning, engaging, and/or bothering, any Six Flags Discovery Kingdom employee or animal care specialist. Any failure to comply may result in a revocation of the single-day ticket/license and/or any type of season pass, including but not limited to the foregoing list.

The foregoing rules apply to all guests, regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, or other protected class.
